Binding Research Project Theme THE CAMPANA PROJECT

CAMPANA project (Connect art, music, and physics to accelerate innovation) aims to facilitate communication between scientists on the topic of nuclear fusion involving scholars and young music composers. The scientific and training objective/project that Institution and the Company aim to implement with participation in the doctoral course is as follows:

Implementing the sonification of scientific data on hydrogen fusion, obtained from experimentation on the "Consorzio RFX" research plants, with the aim of "visualizing" through sounds the phenomena at the basis of magnetic confinement plasma and acceleration of high-energy neutral particles. The RFX-mod2 fusion plant uses a magnetic field to





higher than that of the Sun's core. The ultimate goal of the research is to generate electricity from the fusion of hydrogen. wide The visualization and sonification of data can help achieve this goal more quickly. During a single RFX-mod2 experiment, more than a thousand signals will be acquired. Sonification allow for a overview of the entire data set even in the short time available between one discharge and the next.

The research project will have to develop the themes related to choral singing and its development over the centuries in an interdisciplinary and in-depth way, without forgetting the value of performative dissemination and technological innovation and paying particular attention to the relationship between the musician and the cultural context in which he/she operated.



An itinerary that also shows sensitivity to educational aspects aimed at exploring specific strategies for the transversality of learning and Special Education for Inclusion, following the innovative components introduced research in the field of music neuroscience.

POSITIONS WITHOUT A SCHOLARSHIP (MINISTERIAL DECREE 470/2024) The PhD program also offers two positions without a scholarship: one on themes consistent with the areas of the NRRP and the objectives of the PhD in Music, Performance and Scientific Innovation; and one on a project aimed at enhancing the historical bibliographic-musical funds that are held in the Conservatory Library, with particular reference to manuscript and printed sources collections that are expression of the Venetian musical tradition. The artistic research activity will have to build an itinerary path that, archival starting from and historical-bibliographical research, leads the to identification of significant musical testimonies of which to produce editions and performances.

The number of positions and scholarships may be increased if additional funding becomes available, without prejudice to the deadlines for submitting the application indicated in the Call for Applications. Changes, updates, or additions to the PhD Program Sheet will be published even after the application deadline but no less than ten days before the oral exam.

Those who are awarded a PhD position are subject to the requirements established by the Faculty Board within the framework of the training and research projects, without prejudice to the law, the provisions of the Call for Applications, and the accounting rules related to the funding sources of specific positions.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS TO BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION

Only **documents written in Italian or English** will be considered valid and evaluated by the Commission. For identity documents and academic qualifications issued in a different language, an official translation into Italian or English must be attached, certified by the issuing institution or an authorized body.

The *curriculum vitae* of candidates for the last 10 solar years preceding the year of publication of the Call for Application will be primarily evaluated and must be considered consistent with the research topics of the PhD Program. Exceptions are academic qualifications and certifications, which can be evaluated even if they predate 10 years.

topics. Candidates wishing to compete for these scholarships must propose a personal project that clearly falls within one of the specific "binding" themes set out in the Call for Application, in accordance with the NRRP Program funded by the European Union - NextGenerationEU.

The written project proposal to be sent to the Board must include the following on the cover age:

- The name of the candidate
- The name of the binding project theme for which the candidate is competing
- The provisional title of the project
- A maximum of 5 keywords

The body of the project proposal must include:

- 1. A project description including indications on: (a) operational methods and particular investigation methodologies or technologies; (b) type of sources; (c) need for travel and site visits; (d) possible difficulties logistical, technical, financial, access to sources, etc. and any proposed solutions; (e) declaration that the project is in conformity with the "do no significant harm" (DNSH) principle, i.e. that the activities foreseen for its implementation will not cause any significant damage to the environment;
- 2. The state of the art: how the project fits into previous studies, also indicating whether the candidate already has experience on the subject, or if he is undertaking a totally new research path;
- 3. The expected results: the innovations compared to the current state of the art and the skills and strengths of the candidate making him/her particularly suitable to carry out such research;
- 4. The distribution of work over the three PhD years;
- 5. An initial bibliography;

The project proposal must have a **maximum length of 10,000 characters, including spaces** (excluding cover page, bibliography, and any illustrations, captions or tables).

ORAL EXAMINATION – Minimum score for passing: 18 points. Maximum score: 30 points.

The oral examination can be taken in either Italian or English (at the candidate's choice) and may involve the use of multimedia programs. It will focus on a discussion of the submitted projects





and aims to assess each candidate's aptitude for research, as well as his/her general knowledge of the PhD program's topics and the chosen binding theme. At the end of the interview, the candidate's knowledge of the English language (or Italian, for those taking the exam in English) will be assessed through an oral translation of a short written text provided by the Board.
